SCOTLAND OVERALL WINNERS
KAY MORAN (SCOT) SINGLES WINNER

For the quadrennial World championships, only the previous top 12 qualified automatically, and the remaining countries had to play qualifying rounds, amongst which results at the Atlantic Rim Games were critical. The Israeli team which had been in the previous 13 log slot qualified comfortably to participate in the 2008 games in New Zealand.

For future World championships, the Atlantic Rim Games will be a critical qualifier for both MEN and WOMEN.

Two sections, 8 each, 7 round robin games with 2 points per win in each discipline.

Top 4 in each section qualify for finals. For overall log each discipline winner awarded 16 points, 15 for second slot, and so on progressively down.

Max. points 64.
